

Reflections on conversations with Mitch Bower in the Columbia River Gorge

countercurrents of sky slate and hail meet an eternity of water moving over rocks moss in pools in puddles

traveling through air it breathes souls permeates skin saturates in cool smooth beads perpendicular gardens tinkling tumbling tremulous

we drift
we dare mysteries
wander through shiny oak
whose tendrils pluck and pull

the gorge is slender saxifrage

its eddies
end
in glens and gloamins
upon hills
valleys
brief scenes
in inches feet and yards
game trails glance off fields of
chocolate lily
blue-eyed mary
but we do not
nor should

instead we drop steadily
to the river below
whose like is fueled
and furnished
by the sponge
the moss we squeeze with gentle steps
beneath our tread
grass widows spring

snow sleet rain
hail
sun in bingen
back to clouds
and rain
it breaths too short to measure

impermanent sun
glistening rock
slippery smooth
moss slick
stone crop succulent
indulgent as these thoughts
its trails undulant
ungulant

we clamber steadily up dip and dally down swing side to side in dales and swales of pregnant camas ready for suntouch

it cannot end

IT ALL BEGAN 11,000 YEARS AGO.

You're looking at the Columbia River Gorge. Contained within its canyon walls is testimony to 11,000 years of human civilization.

Ancient Indian rock carvings called petroglyphs, as well as numerous ar-

Ancient Indian rock carvings called petroglyphs, as weir as infinitious airchaeological sites scattered throughout the area, reveal that in actuality the Gorge
was a prehistoric melting pot. A thriving marketplace, fishing and hunting ground,
for ancient cultures ranging from the coastal regions to the plateau.


Its great river, the mightiest in the Northwest and the route traveled by Lewis &
Clark on their 1805 expedition, thunders through desert, rain forest and mountains

on its journey to the Pacific. Of the 800 species of plants living in the Gorge, 58 are considered rare or endangered and 9 are believed to exist nowhere else on earth. A fact that's also true of the Larch Mountain Salamander.

Without question, historically and ecologically, the Gorge is one of our most valuable natural treasures. And it's our objective to see that it stays that way.

Forever.
